WHAT IS S.O.A.P. & HOW DO I USE IT?

It is easy to quickly read through the Word of God and not really take the time to let it sink in and affect your life. There are many great techniques that can help you process what you read and apply it to your life—the S.O.A.P. method is one way to help you do just that!

S - Scripture

The S is for scripture. As you read through the scripture, take time to slow down, highlight and/or write out key phrases and points as you see them.

O - Observation

The O is for Observation. What do see in what you're reading? Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words? What words or phrases stand out to you?

A - Application

The A is for Application. How can you apply what you're reading to your own life? Are there any actions you need to take or changes that should be made?

P - Prayer

The P is for Prayer. Pray God's Word back to Him. If He has revealed something to you during this time, pray about it.

S.O.A.P. EXAMPLE

Read: James 1:22-25

S - Scripture

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do."

O - Observation

- Written to believers to me.
- What is the point of listening to the Word, but never doing anything?
- The one who acts will be blessed.

A - Application

How often do you read the Word of God or listen to a message preached in His Name and do nothing about it? It's time for me to recognize the importance of hearing the Word of God and make a change in behavior, attitude, etc.

P - Prayer

Father, please help me to not just hear your Word, but to let it change me. Open my heart to what You are saying to me through Your holy scripture. Give me the wisdom and strength to act on what You are calling me to do.

ABOUT THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

The apostle John, one of Jesus's original twelve disciples, wrote this book of the Bible.

The book of John profiles the one true God who is revealed in the person of Jesus Christ.

John wrote this to non-Jewish followers of Jesus sometime between 80-95 A.D.

He was addressing those struggling with the predominant Greek philosophies of the time.

John himself explained his goal in his writing was "These [signs] are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name (20:31)."

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

He was with God in the beginning.

Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Do you think you are in need of signs and wonders to believe and trust in God?



Why was it so difficult for the Pharisees to believe in Jesus?


